Closed Session:

The Executive Director's contract was discussed and the outcome presented open session per SB 1436.

Action Items:

- The Executive Director's contract was renewed for a new three-year term July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2021.
- The Executive Director presented the 2016/17 CRSIG Annual Report for approval and distribution to members. The annual report provides members with an overview of the year's programs, operations and financial position.

Executive Director's Report:

- The Executive Director and Return to Work Specialist provided the Committee with an overview of the National Workers' Compensation Conference recently attended.

Administrative Reports:

- Return to Work Specialist Report - The Workers' Compensation Status Report as of November 30, 2017, shows that for November, Company Nurse received 67 calls and 41 of those calls were referred for medical care. There are currently 40 people in return to work assignments and 32 have been returned back to full duty within 20 days.
- Angela Jacobson, Chief Operations Officer referred to the monthly reports on services provided by Prichard Safety & Health which were included in the agenda. The report as of November 30, 2017 showed that a total of 5,288 employees had been trained and 81 other types of services had been provided to members.
